Gas

Boilers in the cottages and swimming pool are propane gas supplied. In the event of any leakage or emergency the supply can be shut off by closing the valve found immediately outside the door from the utility room. This is clearly labelled.

The propane tanks are located in the field at the rear of the Games Barn and this fenced area containing the tanks is strictly out of bounds.

Please advise us immediately in the event of an emergency.

Electricity

Each cottage has its own independent electricity supply.

Distribution boards are located in the understairs cupboard / living room areas and are clearly accessible.

The fuses are of the latest RCD type and frequently trip when a light bulb blows or in the event of appliance fault. The RCDs are easily reset by pushing the tripped switch upwards.

Please contact us at the Reception in the event of any difficulty.

Electricity continued

In the event we are out and an electrician is required urgently please call Nick Massey on 01803 812492

In the event of a power failure, a torch is provide for your use and is located under the kitchen sink. Please ensure it is returned to this location after use. Please do not use candles in your cottage for safety reasons.

Emergency exit lighting is provided in the swimming pool.

The emergency contact number for Western Power is 0800 365 900

The cost of electricity is included in your rental.

Water

The main water stop-cock for your cottage is located immediately adjacent to the boiler. Please close the valve immediately in the event of a leak and advise us as quickly as possible.

If we are not available, the emergency contact number for South West Water is 0800 169 1133.

Fire

In the event of fire please evacuate your cottage and assemble in the car park. Advise us of any fire immediately and telephone the emergency services (999). There is a payphone located in the entrance lobby of the swimming pool which can be used free of charge for 999 calls.

Fire extinguishers and fire blankets are provided in kitchen areas and are clearly visible. Please familiarise yourself with their operation prior to use.

All cottages are provided with smoke detectors which are mains supplied with battery back-up. In the event of a false alarm (burnt toast etc.) the detectors can be switched off by pressing the reset button

Security

The entire site is protected by a cctv system, with cameras located at each access point.

Guests using the car park do so at their own risk and should ensure cars are locked at all times.

Two sets of keys are provided for your cottage. Please ensure that your cottage is locked whenever left unattended and at night.

Swimming pool is by key entrance only, full details in the separate section for the Swimming Pool.

As in most areas in the UK, it is impossible to provide details of a NHS dentist locally who is willing to undertake emergency dental treatment for non registered patients.

Our own dentist will provide a private service if an appointment can be accommodated. His practice is located on Cadewell Lane, Torquay (tel 01803 612525). If treatment is required out of hours, there is an answerphone message on the above number giving details of the contact for the duty dentist.

FACILITIES

Swimming Pool/ Sauna

Pool Opening Times 8am to 9pm

Closed for maintenance 12 to 1pm

Closed for Water Babies swimming lessons on Mondays 11am to 1pm, and Friday 10.30am to 12 noon school term times only.

The pool is not supervised and it is the parent's responsibility not to allow children under 16 to swim unaccompanied.

Please ensure that the external pool door remains closed for the safety of young children, and that your children do not tamper with the safety equipment.

The pool is covered at night and in cold weather to maintain water temperature. If you wish to swim and the cover is on, please carefully roll it back. Please recover the pool after use and ensure that lights and showers are turned off and the door closed on exit.

The sauna takes £1 coins. The meter is in the entrance porch of the Swimming Pool.

No children under 16 are permitted to use the sauna.

Games Barn

Games Barn Hours – 9am-9pm

The Games Barn is located at the far side of the Orchard

Pool, table tennis and table football are located in the Games Barn. The table football machine requires 20p coins for operation and the Pool table requires 50p coins. Table tennis is free of charge and bats and balls are provided for your use. Please return these to the box provided after use. Children under 8 must be supervised in the Games Barn and we ask that children are encouraged to treat all the facilities with respect.

Tennis

The tennis court is available in daylight hours to all guests (children need appropriate supervision). We have tennis racquets and balls for your use in the Games Barn. Please feel free to borrow these, but ensure they are returned to the Games Barn immediately after use. Tennis balls are for tennis use only.

The tennis court is strictly reserved for tennis. Please limit play to 1 hour if other guests are waiting to use the facility.

Please ensure appropriate footwear (trainers or tennis shoes).

Children's Play Area

There is a large children's play area located in the Orchard including swings, climbing frame, slides and sandpit. These facilities are provided for children under 12. Please keep the cover on the sandpit when it is not in use.

Additionally we have two trampolines, one for guests of all ages and a small one for under 8's.

Large Trampoline Rules:

- No shoes or sharp objects on the trampoline
- Children under 12 must be supervised at all times
- No more than two people may be on the trampoline at a time
- Maximum weight (16 stone/100kg)

Small Trampoline Rules:

- No shoes or sharp objects on the trampoline
- Single use only
- Children must be supervised at all times
- Maximum weight 8 stone/50kg

Trampolines should be used with caution and rules followed at all times.

Go Karts

The Go Karts kept by the Games Barn are provided for general use. The larger kart is designed for all ages and the smaller kart for under 12's. Please encourage children to return them to the Games Barn after use, and do not use them in the car park, driveway or courtyard. Use is restricted to the grassed area in the Orchard for safety reasons.

In the interest of safety, please tell us immediately if any Go Karts are damaged.

Fishing

The lakes are for fishing and not for swimming. Parents please beware as the lakes are deep.

Fishing with barbed hooks is strictly prohibited.

The large lake with the island has been stocked with Rudd, Tench, Mirror and Common Carp. The lake with the lilies has small Rudd and Roach for children's fishing.

All fish caught should be immediately returned to the lakes.

Woodland Walk

You are welcome to explore this area which is rich in wildlife, in particular heron, pheasant, moorhens and ducks. You may also be fortunate to spot Kingfishers and Woodpeckers.

Parents are asked to take extreme care with children as the lakes are unfenced and there are some streams in the area.

Animals

On the property there are Vietnamese pot bellied pigs, goats, cats and dogs. Parents, please ensure that children treat all animals with respect. Please do not let the animals out of their enclosures. Due to health and safety reasons, please ensure children do not attempt to enter any of the animal enclosures.

Animals continued

We are happy for you to feed the animals but please encourage children to wash hands with the disinfectant hand wash provided in the cottages after contact. The animals can eat anything except citrus fruits and meat or fish. The pigs are very partial to baked potatoes and apples.

Outdoor Games

Football, cricket, croquet, etc. can be played on the rear lawn beyond the Swimming Pool. Due to the very low lying ground, however, it is frequently very muddy and you may wish to check this if you do not want to spend your holiday in the laundry room!

Outdoor chess is in the orchard. Please ensure children do not damage the chess pieces. Please reset the board after use.

The courtyard is designated as a quiet area and we would request that you do not allow children to play in this area.

Laundry

The Farmhouse has its own semi-commercial washing machine and tumble dryer. Instructions for each machine are displayed. Please do not overload these machines.

Whilst the running costs of these machines is high, we do not charge for this facility, but in keeping with our environmental policy, we ask all guests to make a contribution of £1 for each occasion a machine is used which will be donated to the Devon Wildlife Trust.

If there is a problem with the machines, please inform us so that we may rectify it.

There is a rotary clothes line located in the garden for your use.

An iron and ironing board are provided and located in the utility room.

COTTAGE INFORMATION

Heating and Hot Water

Central heating is available in the cottages as required. The boiler location and controls are pointed out on arrival.

Televisions & DVD Players

The television in the main living room is digital and has the benefit of Sky HD with all Sky channels available to view. The TV in the second sitting room is analogue and will receive BBC 1&2, ITV & Channel 4.

The DVD players are not recorders, but are very simple to operate. If you have difficulty in operating TVs or DVD players, ask your children in the first instance, and if that fails ask at Reception for assistance where we will promise to confuse!

Televisions in the master bedrooms are currently analogue and receive BBC 1&2, ITV & Channel 4. Additionally, the Sky channel programmed on the main TV can be viewed on the bedroom TVs on channel 5.

Bose Hi Fi

The Bose hifi unit located in the main living room produces sound of quite amazing quality. There is a 6 CD cartridge within the unit and to play just select CD on the remote. You can use the auxiliary button in conjunction with the TV to produce surround sound.

Instructions, Supplies and Maintenance

Instructions are provided within the cottages for all kitchen equipment where necessary. Specific instruction books are located in a kitchen drawer.

We supply all necessary washing and cleaning materials for your stay. In the event that you need further supplies please ask at Reception during opening hours.

A starter supply of toilet rolls is included in your cottage, but we ask that you replenish these yourselves during your stay.

Spare light bulbs are located in a utility room cupboard.

A torch is supplied for your convenience which is also located under the kitchen sink.

Bedding & Towels

Bedding and towels are provided for guests' use and are included in the rental. Please do not use towels supplied in the swimming pool area or at the beach.

Duvets supplied are 10.5 tog and produced from 100% duck down. They are designed for all year round comfort. Similarly our pillows are 100% duck down. Guests with allergies may prefer synthetic pillows and these are available on request.

Guests staying for over one week will be provided with a change of bedding and towels at the end of the first week's stay.

Waste & Recycling

Please assist us in our efforts to minimise waste and maximise recycling by using the appropriate bags and bins provided in the cottage and separating waste accordingly.

Please do not place disposable nappies in any of the bins in the swimming pool. These should be returned to the cottage and placed in the general waste bin or directly in the large wheelie bin. Full details regarding recycling are set out on the separate waste guide.

All waste, once separated, should be placed in the appropriate bins located just outside the back door of the Farmhouse. Bins are only provided for non-recyclables (grey) and for compost (brown). Please place the clear and blue bags for plastic bottles, cans and paper in tied bags next to the wheelie bins. The large wooden gates contain this area and prevent unsightliness. Please ensure the gate to the bin area is kept bolted for security reasons.

Glass bottles should be placed in the plastic storage box provided in the utility room and when full this should be taken to the bin store located in the rear car park where there is a large bottle recycling bin.

Smoking Policy

Smoking is not permitted in the cottages, Games Barn, Exercise room or Swimming Pool area (including terrace). We actively discourage smoking anywhere on site out of respect for all guests, but if you must smoke outside, please do so away from the cottages and remove cigarette ends afterwards.

Garden Furniture & Barbecues

Each cottage is supplied with its own garden furniture and barbecue for your use. You are welcome to barbecue in the rear garden outside your cottage or in the Orchard. Please be considerate to your neighbours when barbecuing. Please do not barbecue in the central courtyard. Please clean barbecues after use ready for the next guests.

Car Parking

The car park is located at the front of the Farmhouse. Three spaces are designated for Farmhouse guests. Please use these designated spaces and ensure you maintain clear access at all times to the owners' garage which is required for deliveries etc. The front entrance off the Compton Lane is accessible only for guests staying in the Farmhouse, staff and for deliveries. This access has been designed for safety reasons and reduces the risk of children mixing with cars. Non-resident visitors to the Farmhouse should use the rear car park accessed from the North Whilborough Lane to avoid congestion. Trolleys, located in the car park, are available to transport luggage.

Cars should not be parked in the courtyard area for safety reasons.

When using the car park, please ensure the gate into the courtyard is firmly shut at all times.

Mobile Phone Reception/ Public Telephone

Compton Pool Farm has limited mobile phone coverage and you may experience problems with reception. The best reception is to be found near the tennis court.

There is a coin operated telephone located in the entrance porch of the swimming pool. It will not accept incoming calls. Emergency calls (999) are free.

Internet Access

The Farmhouse has its own broadband router for your use. For your convenience we have no log-on code or passwords. We also have a wireless broadband router located in Reception. You are welcome to use this facility in Reception between 8am and 9pm. Access to Reception is by the codelock. Use code C345 to gain entry.

Photocopying

There is a photocopier in Reception which you are welcome to use at no charge.

Food Shopping

Small convenience stores

- **Co-op** in Ipplepen – excellent local shop opens until 10.00pm. To get there turn right at the end of our drive, follow up to the main road (Park Hill Garage), turn left and then right into Ipplepen. Continue into the centre of the village and Co-op is just after the Post Office on the left.
- **Cox's Garage, Marldon (Spar)** has a comprehensive range of groceries, supermarket-priced fuel and is a good source for barbecue charcoal etc. Open 6am to 10pm. Located through Compton, straight over the mini-roundabout at Marldon and approx 300yards on right.
- **Spar at Park Hill Cross, Ipplepen** - open until 9.30pm on weekdays, 5pm on Sunday, also with café. This is the nearest shop to us. Turn left from the car park, right at the T junction. Park Hill is at the junction of the A381 at Ipplepen just 1.5 miles from here.

Previous guests using Bungalow stores in Marldon for newspaper and milk deliveries will be sad to learn that the shop is now closed and we have been unable to find a replacement newspaper and milk delivery service.

Local Stores/ Supermarkets

There are very large **Sainsbury's** (open until 10pm) and **Marks & Spencer** (open until 8pm) stores at the edge of Torquay. From Compton, turn left approx 400 yards after the Castle up Widdicombe Lane to join the ring road. Turn right at the first roundabout and follow the road to the 2nd set of traffic lights at the T junction. Turn left and continue for about half a mile and filter right into the Willows at the 3rd set of traffic lights.

Local stores / supermarkets continued

There is a new **Asda** supermarket in Newton Abbot. Proceed to Newton Abbot on the Newton Abbot/ Totnes road. The store is on the left as you go into the town centre. Open 24 hours.

Fermoy's on the Totnes Road on the way to Newton Abbot is a farm shop/ garden centre which is worth a visit for its fruit and vegetable produce and home produced bakery items. There is an excellent butchers shop here and a restaurant. Open every day.

Smaller Local / Organic food shops

Ocombe Farm Shop on Preston Down Road near Marlton. Proceed through Compton and turn left at the junction to the roundabout. Take the second exit and Ocombe Farm is on the left after 200 yards. It has its own bakery, butchers, farm shop and café. They also have nature walks from the car park. Opens 9am to 5.30pm.

Riverford Farm

Slightly further afield, but well worth a visit is Riverford Farm, which is located near Staverton, between Totnes and Buckfastleigh. This is the retail outlet for the largest organic veg box scheme supplier in the UK. It's quite bohemian, but produces and sells outstanding organic fruit and vegetable produce, homemade bread, pies etc. and has an excellent butchers dept.

Take the Buckfastleigh road out of Totnes. Pass Dartington Cider Press centre and turn right at the brown sign to Riverford after approx 1 mile. They also have a second smaller outlet at the top of Totnes High St. (Riverford Goes to Town).

Bulleigh Elms Farm sell home produced free range eggs, chicken pork and beef. They also have locally grown vegetables and excellent homemade cakes and fruit pies. They are located between here and Ipplepen on the left hand side in just under 1 mile. Friendly service. Open every day.

Local Attractions / Things to Do

The area is abundant with tourist attractions, some excellent, others worth a visit. The most popular of which are:

- **Paignton Zoo** - certainly the best Zoo in the UK and one of the best in Europe. Allow at least half a day.
- **Babbacombe Model Village** - the World in Miniature, always a favourite with our guests. Allow 2 to 3 hours
- **Living Coasts** - a small but interesting attraction in the centre of Torquay, featuring penguins and other sea birds. Allow 1 to 2 hours
- **Woodlands Leisure Park** - fun and frivolity for all the family, with good indoor and outdoor activities. Suitable for all ages. Allow half to a full day. Can be very busy at peak times.
- **Pennywell Farm** - excellent for young families. Mainly outdoor, hands on farm animal experience. Fellow Green Tourism Gold Award winners. Allow half a day.
- **Kent's Cavern** - very good and geologically important caves on the edge of Torquay. Allow 2 to 3 hours.
- **Canoe Adventures** - organised River Dart canoeing tours for small and large groups. Explore this most beautiful river starting from Totnes or Tuckenhay with an expert guide. Suitable for all ages. Allow half a day. Green Tourism Gold Award winners.
- **National Trust properties:**
 - Coleton Fishacre** (beautiful gardens and fascinating Art Deco home formerly occupied by the D'Oyly Carte family).
 - Compton Castle**, home of Sir Walter Raleigh and only 400 yards away!
 - Greenway House**, home of Agatha Christie, gardens only at the moment, with superb views of the River Dart. The house is currently being restored.

Local Attractions / Things to Do continued

- **Golf at Dainton Park** - open to visitors. 18 hole parkland course and driving range. Located at Ipplepen on the A381, go to park Hill and turn right towards Newton Abbot. The course is on the right after ½ mile. Tel 01803 815000
- **Horse Riding**
Sorley Riding School at Staverton, near Totnes will provide riding for all ages and abilities. Tel 07974 813389 for bookings and information.
For children's riding only **Rosie Boon at Littlehempston**, also near Totnes, contact on 01803 862206.

Eating Out

Local Pubs

There are literally hundreds of pubs and restaurants in the area, the majority of which we could not recommend because we know they are awful or we have not visited them!

The Bickley Mill is our most local pub which is easily walkable through the car park and towards Stoneycombe. The pub, which we thoroughly recommend, is run by David & Tricia Smith and has recently undergone major refurbishment. It is very friendly, welcoming to children and is totally non-smoking.

Service is very good, with an imaginative menu in a restaurant atmosphere. They have an excellent chef who specialises in fish dishes.

We reckon a budget of £80 to £100 will cover dinner for a family of 4, including drinks. Lunch is less expensive. Booking is essential for Weekends and recommended for weekdays during the peak holiday season. Please book direct with the Bickley Mill on 01803 873201.

Local Pubs continued

The Church House Inn, Marldon

We have also had good reports of the Church House Inn, also recently refurbished, which is a short drive through Compton, first right into Love Lane and is found after approx 400 yards on the right. Walkable only if you are brave and wear luminous clothing! Food is high quality pub dining and prices are similar to the Bickley Mill. Tel 01803 558279

The Old Smokey, Marldon

Many of our guests enjoy the Old Smokey - unpretentious, and ideal for families, serving traditional pub fare at good value prices. Follow the road through Compton to the mini-roundabout at Marldon. Go straight over and the pub is on the left, after 200 yards. Tel 01803 557630

Restaurants

The Elephant, Beacon Quay in Torquay,

The Elephant is the only Michelin starred restaurant in Torbay and is highly recommended. It has a very international menu and service is usually excellent. Predictably busy at weekends, but often quiet during weekdays and at lunchtime. Set menus are very good value in our opinion. Tel 01803 200044

No. 7 Bistro, Torquay

Next door but one to The Elephant, which serves almost exclusively fish. We think it's just as good as Rick Stein's Seafood Restaurant in Padstow. Highly recommended. Always busy, so best to book. Tel 01803 295055

The New Angel, Dartmouth

The only other restaurant in South Devon with a Michelin star, this one also has a celebrity chef, John Burton-Race. It has recently been reopened after a change in ownership and is still outstanding. Recommended for lunch. Very busy, so booking essential. Tel 01803 839425.

Riverford Field Kitchen

An unusual but highly recommended venue for lunch is the Field Kitchen at Riverford Farm. Enjoy a tour of the farm which produces a huge range of organic fruit and vegetables, then savour the irresistible produce in the atmospheric contemporary barn. Lunch is £14 for adults, children half price. Three miles out of Totnes on the A384 to Buckfastleigh, turn right to Landscope/ Woolston Green and the Field Kitchen is on the left. Tel 01803 762074.

Takeaways

Saffron Indian Takeaway in Newton Abbot is very good as is **Hings** Chinese takeaway in Shiphay. Both offer free delivery to your cottage. Menus are provided in your cottage.

The best Indian, by far, is **Café India** in Totnes who sadly will not deliver. It is so good, however, that we recommend collecting, just a 15 minute drive from here. The restaurant is situated at the very top of the High Street. Menus also provided in your cottage.

The best Fish & Chips are at **The London Fryer** in Seaway Rd, Preston, and **Dave Hanbury's** in Babbacombe, winners of several national awards.
